## SCIENCE COMMUNICATION PLAN

Our Science Communication Plan has been completed and will be available soon in our website. In our second year DIVERSICROP will:

- produce <u>5-6 animation videos</u> that will focus on our key stakeholders who will offer their points of view on the importance of crop diversification (e.g., professional chef on the importance of diet diversification)
- start working on our <u>Action cookbook</u> that will reflect the diversity of culinary practices and food choices across the four agroclimatic regions. The cookbook will be divided into the three target crops, presenting their general and nutritional info, as well as both ancient and current recipes in English



### MAJOR YEAR 2 EVENTS

Our second Action year has officially kicked off. We have organised two major events:

1. DIVERSICROP WGs meeting- 26th and 27th May, 2025 in Dublin, IRELAND and ONLINE
This meeting will join the key members/leaders from each WG to discuss the overall progress of the Action and build up the synergies between the five Action WGs.

2. Science & Policy Training School- 4th and 5th June, 2025 in Budapest, HUNGARY

This Training School will focus on training attendees on transformative policies for promoting underutilised crops. The agenda will include topics such as policy studies, stakeholder engagement methods, stakeholder mapping and working in science-policy interface. It will be co-organised with two other EU projects, namely Divinfood and Radiant, fostering networking among DIVERSICROP and members of the two EU projects.
